College Students Travel To Albany to Ask Lawmakers to Protect TAP

Albany – Students, faculty and administrators from across New York will travel to Albany on March 8 to urge state lawmakers to continue to invest in the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP).

More than 100 delegates representing New York’s Association of Proprietary Colleges (APC) will meet with legislators to ask them to reject the governor’s proposal to cut TAP for students attending two year-degree institutions.

This TAP policy will limit access to higher education for many economically disadvantaged students, including single parents, working men and women, and minorities. Many visiting students have the academic qualifications to attend college, but TAP gives them the opportunity and the financial means.
